Cowboy Action

The first cowboy match cartridge has yet to be fired this year so I don't have any match scores to report. This year the cowboy committee has added four new matches to the schedule. They are Wild Bunch matches so this article will focus on the equipment needed for this match. The first Wild Bunch match will be April 3rd, registration starts at 8:30 am and the mandatory safety meeting will be at 9:30 am.

The firearms intended for the match are the 1911 semi automatic handgun in 45 ACP caliber, a model 1897 trench shotgun in 12 gauge and a lever action rifle in any pistol caliber larger than 40 cal. Using these firearms men and women would shoot the traditional class under the SASS Wild Bunch rules. In an effort to let everyone shoot there will be an open class for just about any center fire semi automatic hand gun, any pump shot gun and a lever action rifle in any center fire pistol caliber. All cartridges must have lead bullets and be standard velocity, no magnum ammo. Shot shells are target loads with lead shot. You will need a holster for your handgun and a minimum of four magazines carried on the gun belt.

This match was created by the Single Action Shooting Society based on the 1969 movie "The Wild Bunch" where William Holden and some other famous Hollywood actors stole army firearms and uniforms and dressed as soldiers while robbing a train station. If you have an army uniform please wear it to the match. The movie was set just prior to WWI but any uniform will be welcome. Cowboy clothes will be worn by most of the DSC cowboys but if you don't have cowboy clothes wear anything comfortable to shoot in. So pull that old war relic out of the closet and bring it to the range for a match using military guns from 100 years ago.

Pistol Committee

Pistol RO's must take a pistol refresher class ever 2 years to maintain there pistol RO stats. This is in the SOP.

There are 2 Pistol RO refresher & orientations schedule this year.

The first is Sunday May 22, 2011. 10am to 12pm at the basement range.

The second is Saturday Sept. 24, 2011 10am to 12pm at the basement range.

You will need eye and ear protection as we will end up at the outdoor range. This is also an orientation for new RO's. Everyone will get 2 work hours. I run the refresher with the orientation as it gives new people a chance to meet the RO's, talk with them about running the ranges, and sign up for training on the pistol ranges.

If we need another refresher & orientation this year to cover everyone it can be scheduled later.

IDPA

IDPA is relatively new at DSC so I thought I would write an article explaining a little about this sport. International Defensive Pistol Association (IDPA) started in 1996 as a sport designed around handguns you would use for self-defense. Each scenario represents situations you could encounter in real life. There are divisions for all types of handguns, autos or revolvers. Along with divisions, shooters are required to shoot a classifier match so they are competing against a shooter at the same skill level.

Scoring is accomplished by time, accuracy, and how or whether any mistakes were made shooting the stage. There are scoring rings with points on them. Each point adds .5 seconds to the shooters time. Each penalty also adds time to the shooter. It is a sport that requires you to be fast but accurate and don't make any mistakes.

Most ask what kind of equipment is needed to participate. Well this is pretty simple you need a strong side holster, 3 mags and a double mag pouch. If you are shooting a revolver at least 4 speed loaders. You will also need a garment to conceal you gun. Most use a vest but anything will do. IDPA is not an equipment race rather a contest of the shooter. You don't need to spend a lot on a gun to compete. Spend that money on ammo and come out and shoot.

As with all shooting sports if you come out there will be people happy to get you started. We help new shooters get started at our practices. In the summer we hold practice on Mondays from 5-8. We have monthly matches at DSC on the last Saturday of the month from May to Oct. If you think you have any interest stop at one of our practices and we will give you a new shooter orientation so you too can join the fun.

Rifle Committee

March 3, 2011 was a very busy evening at the DSC clubhouse. At 7:00 pm until 7:31 pm. the 2011 Service Rifle League's sub-committee Chairman Jim Parsons reviewed the season's calendar and open issues to resolution. From 7:31 until 8:09 pm the committee's Treasurer Tony Monterosso reviewed the Rifle Range rates and a motion for the regular committee meeting to adopt. Then at 8:10 pm Dave Carbery called the rifle committee to order. Sub-committee chairs in attendance gave their reports with few questions from the floor. February's meeting minutes were approved by vote from members present without changes. The meeting then adjourned at 9:08 pm. Please, see the Rifle Committee meeting minutes for reports and issues.

On the range, the first Service Rifle practice will be held Saturday April 9, 2011. League shooters who need the season warm-up, the first volley starts at 11:00 am. Break out your chain saws and battery powered tools for a Service Rifle range clean-up and work-bee at 10:00 am Saturday, April 23, 2011. Range Safety Officer Candidates, an NRA certified DSC required training class is scheduled for the club house on April 16, 2011 at 9:00 am until 4:00 pm. The DSC rifle range safety officer orientation class (also required for RSO candidates) is scheduled for the rifle range building on May 7, 2011. Sign-up now for the DSC/CMP Service Rifle Clinic Competition it is scheduled at the club house on June 11th and the rifle range on the 12th both days start at 8:00 am.

All of the rifle leagues for 2011 will start their regular competition season at the beginning of May. It is not too early to sign up for the rifle leagues of your choice. You may register at any time even during the shooting season. Forms are on the web site or hard copies may be had at the business office. The Sporting Rifles (.22 caliber rim fires) are practicing indoors at the Basement Range building on Mondays at 6:00 pm until 8:00 pm. The sporting rifles last of the spring practice sessions are ending on April 25, 2011 then they start outdoors Sunday May mornings and Thursday evenings for league competitions starting May 1, 2011. For the rest of April Senior Small-Bore rifle practices are held on some Tuesday afternoons at the indoor basement range. Contact Gary Dawson before you make the trip. Senior Small-Bore Rifle League competition starts on Tuesday May 3rd, 2011 on the rifle range at 6:00 pm. The Junior Rifles are shooting at 7:30 pm on Fridays in the Basement Range (except on April 22, 2011). Public and club open shooting on the outdoor rifle range is 11:00 am until 3:00 pm on Sundays until the end of April. Small-Bore Silhouettes League competition will start back up in May on the rifle range Tuesdays and Saturdays.

Saturday April Second is the Lever Gun Saloon Shoot at the rifle range from 10:00 am until 12:00 pm. Targets are Playing Cards and Non-Glass Shot Glasses. Shooters may use any caliber lever gun, offhand 25 rounds at 50 yards. Entry fees are ten dollars for adult, plus five dollars if you enter for prize pot and four dollars for juniors. Decorative judging at 9:30 and shots fired at 10:00 am for the 14th Annual Easter morning competitions. Paint six Easter hard boiled eggs for a best of show and shoot on April 24th 2011. Shooting is sandbags prone at 200 yards (no rear rests allowed). Entry is \$10.00, juniors \$4.00, and \$5.00 for the money pot. For additions or changes please, see the Rifle Committee's calendar or coming events list on the DSC web site.

The Detroit Sportsmen's Congress 2011 Service Rifle Clinic and Match

Classroom Saturday June 11 and Match Sunday 12

This clinic is open to any US citizen 14 years or older with a maximum number of 40 students. And will provide instructions for the new junior and adult shooter who wishes to shoot the U. S. Service rifle in competition, and will also provide the instructions for match operations.

The instructors conducting the clinic are certified NRA rifle instructors and are also high power rifle competitive shooters

The entry fees for this clinic and its match: **\$60.00** for D.S.C. members **\$100.00** for non D.S.C. members and **\$30.00** for juniors 14 – 18 years.

Entry fees include all class material, match fees, ammunition fees and the use of a rifle (if needed). Due to limitations of the range a non-refundable pre-registration reservation fee of \$40.00 is requested. In order to insure the ample supply of class materials, fees or deposits must be received **before 28 May**, all entries received after this date will be placed on stand-by. Students who wish a confirmation are to include a self addressed post card or a valid e-mail address with their entry.

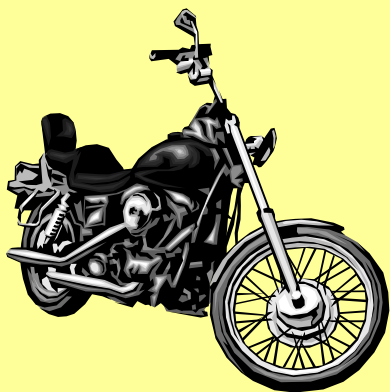

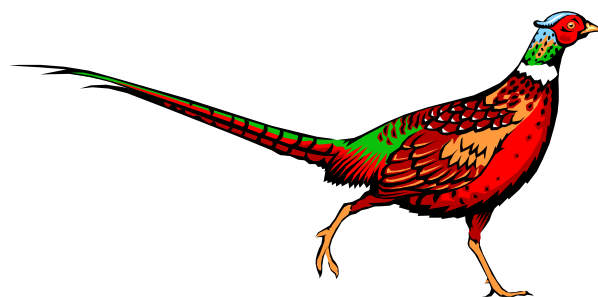

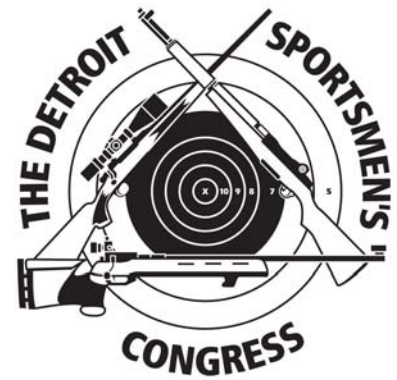
