The DSC hosted the NRA Jr. Sectional Matches again this February. It was one of the best attended Sectionals yet with competitors representing clubs and schools from all parts of the state – even da UP! Four events were fired including 4 Position Smallbore, 3 Position Smallbore, International Air Rifle, and 3 Position Air Rifle.

The DSC juniors had their best showing in the 4P event with Anne Sullivan taking Silver and Eric Krysinski earning Bronze. In the class awards, Sabrina Krafft was 1st J, Demetri Duey took 1st IJ, and Selena Salo captured 2nd IJ. The DSC won the team event.

The DSC also won the 3P Smallbore team event as well with Anne Sullivan winning Silver and Eric Krysinski finishing 1st IJ.

The varsity high school rifle team from Sault Ste. Marie dominated both air rifle events, however, Anne Sullivan won the Silver Medal in International Air Rifle and Eric Krysinski finished 1st IJ.

Scores from this Sectional Match will be combined with scores fired in Sectionals throughout the country to determine the NRA National Indoor Championship.



Congratulations from the Archery Committee and DSC go out to our two most prominent junior members, Jake and Cody Corey. Jake and Cody took top honors in their respective classes in the "Frank Scott Memorial Youth Shoot - Triple Crown" in 2010. This is a three-event shoot that takes place in three completely different locations in spring, summer and fall. They received their First Place trophies at the Michigan Bow Hunters Association Awards Banquet in Grand Rapids in April of 2011.

Service Rifle Clinic/Match Competition

Have you ever wondered, what was it like for one your family members serving in the nation's services to shoot on the firing line with an as issued service rifle? Maybe it is you, who wishes to rekindle a memory of your youth in the service. If so, the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress is conducting a certified Service Rifle Clinic Match Competition. Clinic Scheduled: Saturday June 11, 2011 (9:00 am - 4:00 pm or to end) There is a lunch break with food available. The facility will be Indoor Classroom, with a hand on practical use of M1-Garands and AR-15 rifles and instructions on Match operations. Sunday June 12, 2011(9:00 am until End) - 50 round match firing at 200 yards is open only to those students attending the clinic. The Match Schedule is conducted in accordance with the NRA high powered rifle rules by certified NRA rifle instructors. Conducting the clinic, the instructors are also high power rifle competitors. Open to any US citizen 14 years or older it will Provide instructions for the new junior and adult shooter who wishes to shoot the U. S. Service rifle .30 CAL Garand, .308 M1A, or the 5.56mm AR15. If you wish to use your own service rifle you may bring them. Before use on the range a mandatory safety inspection shall be required.

The clinic/match adult fee is \$90.00 and juniors 14-18 years fee is \$30.00. Entry forms may be picked up at the DSC business office 49800 Dequindre Road, Utica, Mi. 48317 phone: (586)-739-3500 during normal operating hours 10 am until 3 pm MON.-FRI. On the internet select the coming events heading on the DSC web site address: www.dsc.org home page. Sign-up now, a maximum number of students are 40 allowed.

So, you just got your Concealed Pistol License and can not afford to get Basic or Advanced handgun training.

Well here is your chance to get some practice using your equipment to see how everything works together...you, your firearm, your ammo, your holster and your skills.

At DSC Basic Defensive Pistol Practice we will give all shooters an orientation to be sure everyone is familiar with Safety Commands and Range Commands plus we introduce everyone new and seasoned how we prefer the shooter to present from the holster (NRA style). There are reasons for using this presentation (draw) from the holster and for the new or beginning shooters it is much easier for us to keep you and everyone else safe. This is the reason we start shooters out with it.

If after you try the NRA presentation and don't like it...then we will let you show us your presentation from the holster and if we deem it safe for all we will let you use it. But shooters will be required to use this presentation (NRA style) to start out.

DSC Basic Defensive Pistol Practice uses International Defensive Pistol Association rules to govern our practice. IDPA uses rules that go along with Defensive shooting and gives us a solid base for shooting safely and getting some much needed practice.

At DSC Basic Defensive Pistol Practice, we use all types of shooting targets, shoot from behind cover, We use concealment, we practice shooting on the move forward, back, side to side and shooting while transitioning diagonally. We practice what shooters may need to do when things go bad.

Equipment needed in order to participate...safety glasses and ear protection are required, your conceal carry firearm, a holster that covers the trigger and the holster must be attached to a belt on your strong side at 3o'clock for righties and 9o'clock for lefties. You don't have to have magazine holders but they can be used but are not needed (pockets are fine).

DSC Basic Defensive Pistol Practice is no different than any other venue on DSC Property...we have rules in place to keep fellow shooters safe and we are committed to keep our venue safe.

Remember, having a CPL is great but shooters need to get practice just in case!

Rifle Committee

On the April 7, 2011 at 7:32 the Rifle Committee met just outside the pro-shop in the shotgun range house, as the club house was going through some unscheduled maintenance. Sub-committee representatives present gave their reports with some questions from the meeting's attendees. The March meeting minutes were approved by a vote from the floor with no revisions. Please, see the Rifle Committee meeting minutes for reports and issues. The well attended meeting then adjourned.

Range Safety Officer Candidates, the DSC rifle range safety officer orientation class (like the NRA course, it is required for DSC RSO accreditation) is scheduled for May 7, 2011. The Dequindre Road Clean-up is also scheduled for May 7th held at 8:00am safety training will start in the club house. The deadline is here for any recommendations for changes to the 2012 Standard Operational Procedures please get them to Dave Carbery A.S.A.P. The NRA (rifle, pistol, shotgun, home firearm safety, and personal protection) Instructor Certification classes are scheduled for May 3, 10, 17, and 24th. DSC member fee is \$300.00 and non-members fee is \$400.00. Register at the DSC business office or see the Education Committee web page. Fifty percent of the class fee is required at registration entry. Registration for the Michigan DNR Hunter Safety Education Class will be held from 5:00 pm until 8:00 pm May 9, 2011 this date only. Classes are scheduled 13, 14, 15 May, 2011.

The rifle leagues of 2011 have started their regular competition at the beginning this month. For the rifle leagues of your choice, it's not too late to sign up. During the shooting season, you may register at any time. Forms may be picked up at the business office during regular business hours or may be copied from the DSC web site. The Sporting Rifle League meets to shoot on Sundays from 9:00 am until 11:00 am. On the Mondays at 5:00 pm Black Powder Cartridge League riflemen are competing on the range. Small Bore Rifle Silhouette and Senior Small Bore Rifle Leagues shoot together Tuesdays on the range from 6:00 pm until dusk. Service Rifle Leagues shoot on Wednesdays at 6:00 pm, and on Saturdays 9:00 am – 11:00 am. The Sporting Rifle League shoots again on Thursdays at 6:00 pm to sundown at the Rifle Range. Junior Rifle League is competing at 6:30 pm on Fridays in the Basement Range and the Rifle Range until the end of July. The Small Bore Silhouette rifles make their return to the rifle range on Saturdays at 4:30 pm until dusk for more shooting. Open hours for the public on the rifle range is 11:00 am to 4:00 pm Saturdays and Sundays until the end of September unless a competition match is scheduled. Sunday May Fifteenth the rifle range will be closed to the public for the 2011 NRA Michigan State Outdoor Junior Prone and Position Rifle Championship. The DSC is sponsoring this shooting event and is scheduled from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm. The Clinton River Muzzleloaders are having a Service Rifle Woods Walk shoot on May 21, 2011. To enter the competition select the Black Powder Committee's heading or the special events calendar title on the DSC web site. Sign-up now for the DSC Service Rifle Clinic Competition it is scheduled at the club house for June 11th and the rifle range on the 12th both days start at 8:00 am. The match schedule is conducted in accordance with the NRA high powered rifle rules. DSC member fee is \$60.00, non-member fee is \$90.00, and juniors 14 years to 18 years fee is \$30.00. Entry forms may be picked up at the business office during normal operating hours or select the special events heading on the DSC web site. On Saturday April 9, 2011 the first Service Rifle practice was held. League shooters warmed up on the range and avoided the wet sod by walking the service road to score their targets. The Detroit Sportsmen's Congress 2011 Service Rifle Clinic and Match Classroom Saturday June 11 and Match Sunday 12

This clinic is open to any US citizen 14 years or older with a maximum number of 40 students. And will provide instructions for the new junior and adult shooter who wishes to shoot the U. S. Service rifle (.30 CAL Garand - .308 M1A or the 5.56mm AR) in competition, and will also provide the instructions on match operations.

The instructors conducting the clinic are certified NRA rifle instructors and are also high power rifle competitive shooters

The entry fees for this clinic and its match: **\$60.00** for D.S.C. members **\$90.00** for non D.S.C. members and **\$30.00** for juniors 14 – 18 years.

Entry fees include all class material, match fees, ammunition fees and the use of a rifle (if needed). Due to limitations of the range a non-refundable pre-registration reservation fee of \$40.00 is requested. In order to insure the ample supply of class materials, fees or deposits must be received **before 28 May**, all entries received after this date will be placed on stand-by. Students who wish a confirmation are to include a self addressed post card or a valid e-mail address with their entry.

President's Report: (B. Saylor for B. Savo) • Honor past presidents and Mr. Jim Delaney. • Honor Life Members • We are going to start on the clubhouse bathrooms on Monday, April 11th @ 9:00am. We are going to gut the both old bathrooms and put in new porcelain fixtures, and new ceramic floor tile. Mr. Savo is heading up the project. We are also going to re-do the foyer area using the ¼ logs, and a new drop ceiling so we can make a better presentation of the foyer entry. If anybody wants to help, just show up on Monday @ 9:00am. Basically it's going to be demolition. There will be some deluxe port-a-johns with sanitizing stations set up outside. There's a company on Ryan road that supplies those, so that's where we went. 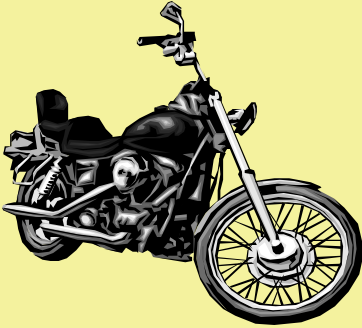

COURSE OF FIRE:

The NRA Smallbore Rifle course consists of:

10 chickens at 40 meters

10 pigs at 60 meters

10 turkeys at 76 meters

10 rams at 100 meters

Each set of animals is shot in two banks of 5, one shot at each target. There is a time limit of 2 minutes and 30 seconds to fire 5 shots. All shooting for score is from the offhand position.

REGISTRATION/FEES:

You need not join the league to come out and shoot the course of fire, but league shooters will be given preference if we have a full line. A one-time (annual) league fee of \$40.00 is due prior to the start of the season. An additional \$55.00 fee will be assessed for Associate Memberships. The league fee covers the league banquet with door prizes. The Banquet is normally held the first Saturday in December. Range Fees are \$6.00 for Members and Associate Members and \$12.00 for Guests, payable prior to the match. If a Full Member wishes to participate in the Sporting Rifle or Service Rifle leagues, no additional league fees will be charged. Every shooter also pays a \$1 Environmental fee, in addition to the Range Fee.

LEAGUE SCORING:

A competitor's highest 10 scores will be used to determine league standings. Awards will be given to the high scorer in the Master, AAA, AA, and B classes in both Smallbore Rifle and Smallbore Hunting Rifle. Spotters are strongly encouraged, as a competitor should not score his own card. Practice scores may be shot, if it will not displace a competitor from the line who is shooting for record. All record scorecards must be turned in to the R.O. upon completion of the match.

NOTE:

This is a lot more fun and relaxed than the formal rules make it sound. Come and try it!

POLICE PISTOL COMBAT (PPC) Shooters,

We will have a Summer PPC League at the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress in 2011 on Wednesday nights from 6:30 pm. to approx. 9:00 pm. All shooting will be done on our Indoor Range located in the basement of the Shotgun Building on Dequindre Rd. just North of Hamlin Rd. If you have never shot PPC, come on down and check it out!

The League dates will be as follows:

June 1, 8, 15, 22, 29

July 6, 13, 20, 27

PPC League Course of fire: Match 5 of the NRA course at 50 ft., using reduced B-27 targets. This is a 60 round course of fire. NRA rules allow .32 caliber or larger in a revolver and .35 caliber or larger in a pistol. Many shooters use a six shot revolver firing .38 Specials while others use 9mm, .40, or .45 caliber semi-autos. A minimum of 4 speed-loaders or magazines are required. The shooting positions used in PPC are: standing unsupported, standing with barricade support using first the left then right hand, kneeling, sitting, and prone.

NO MAGNUM OR HIGH SPEED AMMUNITION ALLOWED. EYE AND EAR PROTECTION IS MANDATORY. SAFETY RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

We will shoot a total of Eight (8) scores, with final League standings based on the best 6 of the 8 scores. Cash awards will be given following the end of the season and will be based on any points accumulated throughout the season. We use the Lewis system to award points, so shooters of all skill levels have a chance to earn points.

League fees will be \$20.00. Half of your league fees must be turned in prior to your second (2nd) score with the balance prior to you shooting your fourth (4th) score.

There is a Range fee payable each week of \$6.00 for all DSC League members. One dollar of this will go to the fund to cover cost of getting the impact area cleaned. Non-Members must obtain an Associate Membership for \$30.00, which is good ONLY for the duration of the PPC League (9 weeks). The range fee of \$6.00 must then be paid each week, as do all other League members.

Smoking of sights can be done only in an area designated by the range Officer or League Director. NO dry firing except on the firing line with the Range Officers approval.

We need shooters to make this league a success. The only thing we ask is that you give us a hand in setting up and cleaning up whenever you can.

This is a good opportunity to keep your skills sharp in anticipation of the Fall 2011 PPC League and the PPC Matches that occur later in the year
