Ken Peters is our new board representative. You are encouraged to attend the membership meetings to help support the requests and concerns of the campground. Hoping to get the electrical started within one year.

The Wild Turkey Federation will be planting plots to feed turkeys across Oakwood Road. The area will have trails in an educational area with names of the plant. John Perrin and Ken LePage will set up work bees to get the work completed. If your interested in helping with setting up the area please see them. Scout troops are also invited to help Sunday through Friday. They'll receive free camping across the road. The plans are to have a path that will be made into an educational area and then there will be signs made with the names of the trees and what animals like to eat them placed along the path. The children can read as they walk the path to the different feeding areas.

There was a motion made during the meeting:

Motion: To allow the length of your deck to be the same length of your trailer. No section to exceed a maximum of 10 feet in width, or length. All decks may be no higher then 6 inches from the bottom of deck to ground on high side of lot, leveled to the low side. Movable steps with small landing and hand rails may be placed on deck for door(s) entry. No permanent obstructions allowed on decks. Decks may be modified to A.D.A. Specifications, i.e. ramps, with approval of executive committee.

Service Rifle Clinic/Match Competition

Have you ever wondered, what was it like for one your family members serving in the nation's services to shoot on the firing line with an as issued service rifle? Maybe it is you, who wishes to rekindle a memory of your youth in the service. If so, the Detroit Sportsmen's Congress is conducting a certified Service Rifle Clinic Match Competition. Clinic Scheduled: Saturday June 11, 2011 (9:00 am - 4:00 pm or to end) There is a lunch break with food available. The facility will be Indoor Classroom, with a hand on practical use of M1-Garands and AR-15 rifles and instructions on Match operations. Sunday June 12, 2011(9:00 am until End) - 50 round match firing at 200 yards is open only to those students attending the clinic. The Match Schedule is conducted in accordance with the NRA high powered rifle rules by certified NRA rifle instructors. Conducting the clinic, the instructors are also high power rifle competitors. Open to any US citizen 14 years or older it will Provide instructions for the new junior and adult shooter who wishes to shoot the U. S. Service rifle .30 CAL Garand, .308 M1A, or the 5.56mm AR15. If you wish to use your own service rifle you may bring them. Before use on the range a mandatory safety inspection shall be required.

The clinic/match adult fee is \$90.00 and juniors 14-18 years fee is \$30.00. Entry forms may be picked up at the DSC business office 49800 Dequindre Road, Utica, Mi. 48317 phone: (586)-739-3500 during normal operating hours 10 am until 3 pm MON.-FRI. On the internet select the coming events heading on the DSC web site address: www.dsc.org home page. Sign-up now, a maximum number of students are 40 allowed.

Starting promptly at 7:30 pm all sub-committee representatives present reported with few questions from the attendees present. The recorded minutes for April's meeting were approved without revisions and the meeting adjourned about 8:25 pm. Please, see the Rifle Committee meeting minutes for issues, reports and financials.

To all on the rifle range, vehicles are only allowed on the service road. With record snowmelt, rainfall and flooding, we ask that all vehicles be kept off the grass until the next drought or at least two years without snow or rain. This includes the range buggy. The lawn cutting equipment does not work well in a plowed field. Thank You to all who came out for the April 23rd range work bee. Because of the hard work of all and a great attendance quitting time came early. Rifle range safety officers the next DSC refresher class will be on August 14, 2011 at the rifle range building. A Range Officer NRA Certification course is scheduled for August 22nd and 23rd, 2011. Like the NRA course, a DSC Range Safety Officer Orientation accreditation) is planned for September 11th, 2011. The Sporting Rifle League is competing on Sundays from 9:00 am until open public shooting at 11:00 am. 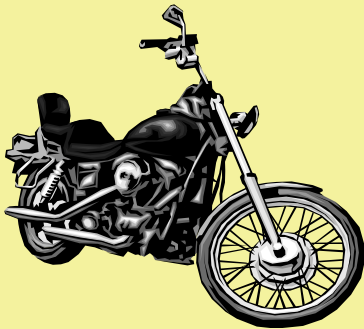

DATES:

Every Tuesday and Saturday, 5/3/2011 through 9/27/2011.

LOCATION:

DSC 200 yard Rifle Range, 49800 Dequindre, Utica, MI

STARTING TIMES:

Tuesdays: Shooting begins at 6:00pm

Saturdays: 4:30pm sight-in begins. Shooting begins PROMPLY at 5:00pm.

COURSE OF FIRE:

The NRA Smallbore Rifle course consists of:

10 chickens at 40 meters

10 pigs at 60 meters

10 turkeys at 76 meters

10 rams at 100 meters

Each set of animals is shot in two banks of 5, one shot at each target. There is a time limit of 2 minutes and 30 seconds to fire 5 shots. All shooting for score is from the offhand position.

REGISTRATION/FEEES:

You need not join the league to come out and shoot the course of fire, but league shooters will be given preference if we have a full line. A one-time (annual) league fee of \$40.00 is due prior to the start of the season. An additional \$55.00 fee will be assessed for Associate Memberships. The league fee covers the league banquet with door prizes. The Banquet is normally held the first Saturday in December. Range Fees are \$6.00 for Members and Associate Members and \$12.00 for Guests, payable prior to the match. If a Full Member wishes to participate in the Sporting Rifle or Service Rifle leagues, no additional league fees will be charged. Every shooter also pays a \$1 Environmental fee, in addition to the Range Fee.

LEAGUE SCORING:

A competitor's highest 10 scores will be used to determine league standings. Awards will be given to the high scorer in the Master, AAA, AA, and B classes in both Smallbore Rifle and Smallbore Hunting Rifle. Spotters are strongly encouraged, as a competitor should not score his own card. Practice scores may be shot, if it will not displace a competitor from the line who is shooting for record. PPC League Course of fire: Match 5 of the NRA course at 50 ft., using reduced B-27 targets. This is a 60 round course of fire. NRA rules allow .32 caliber or larger in a revolver and .35 caliber or larger in a pistol. Many shooters use a six shot revolver firing .38 Specials while others use 9mm, .40, or .45 caliber semi-autos. A minimum of 4 speed-loaders or magazines are required. The shooting positions used in PPC are: standing unsupported, standing with barricade support using first the left then right hand, kneeling, sitting, and prone.

NO MAGNUM OR HIGH SPEED AMMUNITION ALLOWED. EYE AND EAR PROTECTION IS MANDATORY. SAFETY RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

We will shoot a total of Eight (8) scores, with final League standings based on the best 6 of the 8 scores. Cash awards will be given following the end of the season and will be based on any points accumulated throughout the season. We use the Lewis system to award points, so shooters of all skill levels have a chance to earn points.

League fees will be \$20.00. Half of your league fees must be turned in prior to your second (2nd) score with the balance prior to you shooting your fourth (4th) score.

There is a Range fee payable each week of \$6.00 for all DSC League members. One dollar of this will go to the fund to cover cost of getting the impact area cleaned. Non-Members must obtain an Associate Membership for \$30.00, which is good ONLY for the duration of the PPC League (9 weeks). The range fee of \$6.00 must then be paid each week, as do all other League members.

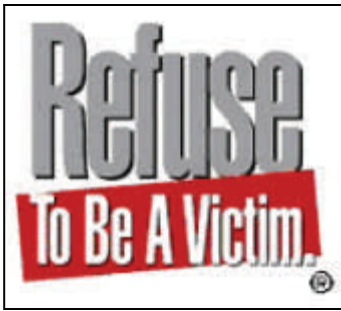
Smoking of sights can be done only in an area designated by the range Officer or League Director. NO dry firing except on the firing line with the Range Officers approval.

Basic Defensive Pistol Practice

Where: Detroit Sportsmen's Congress-outdoor pistol range

When: Wednesday's 5pm to 8pm weather permitting

Fees: Are the same as open shooting.

For beginning/CPL/basic handgun users: who want to use and get some practice while using their carry weapon, ammo, and holster as well as yourself to find out how everything works together...this is very important! Your life depends on it!

If a SHTF event happens---- EVERYTHING HAS TO WORK! POSITIVELY!!!!

Equipment needed for Basic Defensive Pistol Practice:

The self defense pistol/revolver that you use, a Strong side holster that covers the trigger that will be at your strong side at the 3 o'clock position. Ammo needed 150+ rounds-you can use less if not enough ammo is available.

We will discuss handgun topics regarding basic usage. An orientation will be given to all new shooters to make sure presentation from the holster is safe for all. During this time we evaluate a shooters skill level and coach more if more practice is needed. And then we discuss range commands and safety issues here at DSC.

This practice will not use competition time or scoring, But we do encourage marksmanship! We only use a timer to start the planned shooting course of fire. We practice shooting from cover, shooting on the move forward and back, right to left and shooting in transition diagonally left to right and right left. We practice malfunction drills and how to clear them. We also on occasion set up a stage similar to IDPA a let you see how well you do in a situation.

You are NOT required to attend all the practices. You can show up anytime between 5pm and 7pm and get the orientation, but the sooner you are here the more practice shooting you will get **J**!

We use International Defensive Pistol Association rules (go to www.idpa.com for more info) to establish a safe range and conditions to keep every one safe.

At DSC Safety is our main concern! Even though we use IDPA rules, we want to take the pressure of competition out of the way so you can learn the basics safely.

Remember Concealed Carry is a serious responsibility! It's up to you to get the practice you need to keep your skill levels sharp!
