



Overview of Environmental Stewardship

The Detroit Sportsmen's Congress (the Club), although it had a brief history of gravel mining and disposal of some general refuse and demolition waste on its Property, it has a proud tradition of caring for the Property. Set forth below are the reminders of the need to follow good environmental practices on the Club's Property.

- The Club is committed to being good stewards of the environment. It is the Club's mission to protect the environment, the grounds and surrounding watershed through a plan of property maintenance and land improvements.
- As a Club, health and safety are our first concern in operations. It is our intent to provide a setting that reduces risk and allows members and invited guests to practice their sport in a safe environment.
- As you know, the Club also has land, facilities and camping opportunities at its other location in Oxford. The mission is to protect the environment in it's applicable to operations in Oxford.
- The Club has a program for the lead reclamation and recycling lead materials for both their economic and environmental benefits.
- The Club has many features both in its operations, regulations, site maintenance and that are specifically designed to protect visitors and Club members from exposure to subsurface waste, particularly in the area of the front berm.
- The Club will be recording a "use restriction" on the Property to publicly state its policy of limiting soil disturbances in the areas of the historical landfill activities. Soil disturbances are allowed when due care efforts are maintained and work is done at the direction and with the approval of the Club. The Club also restricts the installation of wells on the Property.
- there is a soil and vegetative cover in areas such as the front of the front berm that is used to create a barrier between buried debris and Club members and their guests while on the Property. If you observe someone disturbing areas such as the berm without Club approval, please contact a Club officer or the Business Operations Manager [BOM] (Bonnie Palmer) in the Office or the employee tending the bar in the clubhouse.
- When independent contract workers and utility workers (such as electrical, phone and gas) are performing work on the Property, they will be advised of the need to use caution in filled areas on the Property. If you believe such workers are not using proper care on the Property, please advise the BOM.
- There is a stream that runs along the north side of the Property; which is a part of the Clinton River Watershed. There are adjoining low areas along the stream that are protected wetlands. It is the Club's policy to restrict impact to these wetlands and stream areas.
- The Club has established an Environmental Fund for the maintenance of the conditions on the Property.
- There are methane probes/vents on the Property (which will be surveyed). These methane probes/vents cannot be moved or altered without approval.
- Any modification to its soils or the layout of ranges on the Property will be done in a manner that takes into consideration the impact to the environment.

Each of the above precautions is designed to protect the environment, health and safety of the Club members, and guests. Your cooperation and support in this effort is appreciated by the Club. Taking such steps will continue to serve the Club well from a legal and risk management perspective.

Cowboy Action

As winter approaches October is the end of two cowboy matches a month. It was a good year with the introduction of Wild Bunch Matches. Cowboys needed something new and matches using military guns circa 1910 fit the bill. The last Wild Bunch Match of the year was October 2nd. Thirteen cowboys enjoyed a day on the range. The top DSC cowboy was Coyote Claxton followed by Nine Finger Bob and Camptown. October 18th was a great day for the regular cowboy match. Apache Wolf, a young gun, took first place followed by J.J. Longley and Shotgun Willy. Congratulations to every one for a great day on the range. Manny thanks to Penny Ante for all the great lunches she provides after the matches. The next cowboy match will be November 20th. Bring the family and jug of warm cider and enjoy the match.

Stagecoach travel in the Wild West

I know that stagecoaches aren't exactly cowboy but I'm sure that at some point in history a cowboy rode is a stagecoach.

Stagecoach travel started in 1827 when the Abbot Downing Company built the first of many models of coaches. The first coach known at the Concord seated nine people in three seats. The narrow coaches allowed each passenger about fifteen inches of a bench seat with little leg room. Although cramped inside the coaches were known as "a cradle on wheels" due to the leather strap suspension. Instead of springs which were rough riding the passenger compartment was suspended by leather straps which gave the coach a baby cradle motion.

Often braving terrible weather, pitted roads, treacherous terrain and Indian and bandit attacks, the coach lines carried on during westward expansion despite the hazards. Two events in history ensured the stagecoaches placed in history. In the early 1850's the 49's gold rush provided many passengers heading west to the gold fields. These people demanded mail service to the folks back home faster than the 6 months to a year that was required for a ship to travel from the east coast to the west coast around South America. The government issued contracts to coach lines to transport mail from Saint Louis Missouri to San Francisco California. The distanced was 2800 miles and had to be completed in 25 days.

Along the many stage routes stations were established every 12 miles. Small stations provided only fresh horses for the coaches. The passengers could stretch their legs while the horse team was being changed. The large stations with overnight accommodations were about 50 miles apart. Each leg of the trip between the stations was called a stage, hence the name stagecoach.

As the railroad continued to push westward stagecoach service became less and less in demand. With the completion of the transcontinental railroad in 1869 transcontinental stagecoach service came to an end, however this was not the end of the stagecoach. Stagecoach service continued for decades in areas without railroad service. The introduction of the automobile lead to the end of the stagecoach in the early 1900's

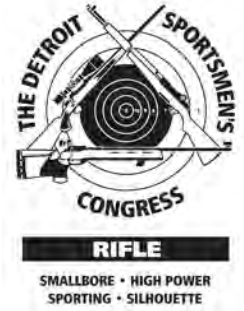
