We want to update you on our nephew Brian Thompson's progress. Since he received the kidney transplant on Nov. 13th it has been a real battle. The first week all looked great and he went home on the 17th but was readmitted to hospital on the 20th. Since then he has had numerous problems including a heart attack, infections, then back on dialysis for a spell. He was able to go home for Christmas but is back in the hospital with another infection. Cowboy Action

The cowboys take a vacation from matches in January and February so there are no match results to report. We still practice every Saturday from 10:00 am to 12 noon so come out and see some

cowboy guns in action. This month on the third Saturday the cowboys will have their committee meeting followed by cowboy skeet with our coach guns. Coach guns are shot guns, 12 or 20 gauges with 20 inch barrels and cylinder chokes. There not bad but a skeet gun is much better.

This year we have added two new matches to the line up. First in March will be a twilight match with regular cowboy guns. The match will be a three stage match starting about an hour before sunset and continuing into darkness. The steel targets will be painted white and illuminated with candles. This should be challenging.

Next in June will be a military service rifle match utilizing bolt action rifles from any country. This match will be shot from 25 to 40 yards at steel and shoot through targets.

We will continue having cowboy silhouette matches using iron sight cowboy rifles. These matches are shot with larger than normal targets because we are not using optical sights. Calibers are 22 rim fire and center fire pistol calibers. The match will be fired from 25 to 50 yards at chickens, pigs, turkeys and rams. We have classes for everyone so if you only have a rifle with a scope we will not turn you away.

Rim fire shooter will not be forgotten. We will have a cowboy match using rim fire hand guns and rifles. The targets for these matches are made of lighter steel so a light bullet impact can be scored.

And last the wild bunch matches will continue. To shoot this match you will need a 1911 handgun in 45 ACP, a 1897 pump shotgun and a lever action rifle 40 caliber or larger. As in regular cowboy steel targets are shot from 7 to 15 yards but instead of using two handguns multiple magazine changes are made in the 1911 and the shotgun is loaded before the timer starts.

Range Safety Officer Recruits, the first of 2012 N.R.A. certification course will be held on the Tenth of March from 9:00 am until 4:00 pm. Contact the business office or the Education Committee's calendar of events on the DSC web site to register. Another certification you will need is the D.S.C. Rifle Range Officer Orientation Course scheduled for May 12th 2012 at 4:30 pm till 7:00 pm location to be announced. An NRA Basic Rifle Course is being offered to members for Sixty dollars, non-members Ninety dollars, and Thirty dollars for juniors. Dates are on Fridays Feb. 17, 24, Mar. 02, 09, 16,25, and 30 from 7:00 pm. until 9:30 pm. If interested see John Butler or the application on the web site. An NRA Metallic Cartridge Reloading Course for Rifle & Pistol will be held on Saturday March 17, 2012 from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm at the DSC Club House. Fee is \$70.00 or DSC Members \$50.00 All classroom material is provided. Pre-registration is required and limited to 25 students. For a registration form see the Education Coming Events page on the DSC web-site or at the business office during regular operating hours.

The Rifle Range's Open Public shooting hours are Sundays only 11:00 am till 3:00 pm until the rifle leagues start this spring. A Junior Rifle Match is scheduled in the Basement Range for February 04 and 05, 2012 7:30 am – 8:30 pm on both days. The Junior Small Bore Rifle League meets at 7:30 pm on every Friday to compete in the Basement Range. The Tenth Annual Ground Hog Shoot is on Sunday January 29th at 10:00 am. Adult fee is \$10.00 includes environmental fee and may participate in the money pot for \$5.00. Adult competitors please bring six two liter plastic bottles of diet soda (preferred it's not sticky) to hang as your targets at 200 yards. Juniors (Fourteen years and under) pay the range fee only to participate and bring six sixteen ounce plastic bottles of diet soda (still preferred) for your targets at 50 yards. When the targets are hit they spin around fast and paint the snow. A 3rd Annual Paper Back Book competition shoot on the rifle range will happen February 12th, 2012 from 10:00 am until 12:00 pm. This is a luck shoot hidden targets in the two paperback books provided by shooter and one novelty target, bring additional books if you want. Course of fire is 10 rounds per book and 10 rounds at a novelty target, 30 rounds total at 50 yards from the bench or sitting if you prefer. Rim-fires are preferred, but any caliber is acceptable. Fees are \$10 per adult shooter, \$4 per junior shooter, add \$5 if you want to get in the money pot. Sunday March 04, 2012 is the Third Annual Lever Gun Saloon Shoot at the rifle range from 10:00 am until 12:00 pm. Targets are Playing Cards, Shot Glasses Etc. Shooters may use any caliber lever gun, 25 rounds; offhand standing, at 50 yards. Entry fee is ten dollars for adult, plus five dollars if you enter for prize pot and four dollars for juniors.

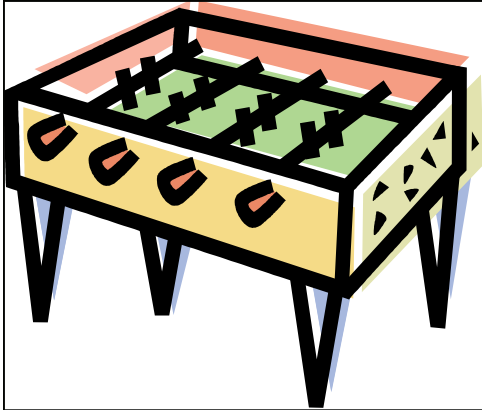

POLICE PISTOL COMBAT (PPC) Shooters,

We will again have a Winter **PPC League** at the **Detroit Sportsmen's Congress in 2012** on Wednesday nights from 6:30 pm. to approx. 9:00 pm. All shooting will be done on our Indoor Range located in the basement of the Shotgun Building on Dequindre Rd. just North of Hamlin Rd. If you have never shot PPC, come on down and check it out!

The League dates will be as follows:

February 1, 8, 15, 22, 29

March 7, 14, 21, 28

April 4, 11

PPC League Course of fire: Match 5 of the NRA course at 50 ft., using reduced B-27 targets. This is a 60 round course of fire. NRA rules allow .32 caliber or larger in a revolver and .35 caliber or larger in a pistol. Many shooters use a six shot revolver firing .38 Specials while others use 9mm, .40, or .45 caliber semi-autos. A minimum of 4 speed-loaders or magazines are required. The shooting positions used in PPC are: standing unsupported, standing with barricade support using first the left then right hand, kneeling, sitting, and prone.

NO MAGNUM OR HIGH SPEED AMMUNITION ALLOWED. EYE AND EAR PROTECTION IS MANDATORY. SAFETY RULES WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

We will shoot a total of Twelve (12) scores, with final League standings based on the best 10 of the 12 scores. Cash awards will be given following the end of the season and will be based on any points accumulated throughout the season. We use the Lewis system to award points, so shooters of all skill levels have a chance to earn points.

League fees will be \$30.00. Half of your league fees must be turned in prior to your **second (2nd) score** with the balance prior to you shooting your **fourth (4th) score**.

There is a Range fee payable each week of \$6.00 for all DSC League members. One dollar of this will go to the fund to cover cost of getting the impact area cleaned. **Non-Members must obtain an Associate Membership for \$30.00**, which is good **ONLY** for the duration of the PPC League (14 weeks). The range fee of \$6.00 must then be paid each week, as do all other League members.

Smoking of sights can be done only in an area designated by the range Officer or League Director. NO dry firing except on the firing line with the Range Officers approval.

We need shooters to make this league a success. The only thing we ask is that you give us a hand in setting up and cleaning up whenever you can.
