

Service Rifle Range Commands

Each phase will have a 3-minute preparation time. Shooters may handle rifles and dry fire.

Off Hand: 10 rounds in a time limit of 10 minutes.

Shooters on the line with one round load.

Is the line ready? The line is ready

Ready on the right

Ready on the left

All ready on the firing line. You may commence fire. “start timer”

When the time ends, ask if there are any saved rounds. If the person is shooting for practice, they may fire the remaining shoots after the RO has given the okay. If the person is shooting for score, they're out of luck and the saved rounds will be counted as misses.

Make the line safe, mags out, bolts open, flags in and safeties on.

Sitting Rapid Fire: 10 rounds in a time limit of 60 seconds.

Is the line ready? The line is ready

Ready on the right

Ready on the left

Ready on the firing line. You may commence fire. “start timer”

When the time ends, ask if there are any saved rounds. If the person is shooting for practice, they may fire the remaining shoots after the RO has given the okay. If the person is shooting for score, they're out of luck and the saved rounds will be counted as misses.

Make the line safe, mags out, bolts open, flags in and safeties on.

Prone Rapid Fire: 10 rounds in a time limit of 70 seconds.

Is the line ready? The line is ready

Ready on the right

Ready on the left

Ready on the firing line. You may commence fire. “start timer”

When the time ends, ask if there are any saved rounds. If the person is shooting for practice, they may fire the remaining shoots after the RO has given the okay. If the person is shooting for score, they're out of luck and the saved rounds will be counted as misses.

Make the line safe, mags out, bolts open, flags in and safeties on.

Slow Fire Prone: 20 rounds in a time limit of 20 minutes.

Shooters on the line with one round load.

Is the line ready? The line is ready

Ready on the right

Ready on the left

All ready on the firing line. You may commence fire. “start timer”

When the time ends, ask if there are any saved rounds. If the person is shooting for practice, they may fire the remaining shoots after the RO has given the okay. If the person is shooting for score, they're out of luck and the saved rounds will be counted as misses.

Make the line safe, mags out, bolts open, flags in and safeties on.

Safety Notes:

1. Everyone should have a yellow safety flag. The only time it can be removed is during prep and live fire time.
2. When shooter go to load and close the bolt, the muzzle must be level to the berm incase of a slam fire.
3. Once the rifle is loaded, the muzzle must stay below the berm.
4. In the rapid fire phases, when the command to load has been given, the bolts are to remain open until the shooter is in position. During sitting when the persons butt is on the ground and in prone when the person is laying down. Note that this doesn't apply to people that are over 60 or shooting an M1 Garand.
