League Type

High Power Rifle: the NRA Service Rifle or Match Rifle - see NRA rulebook for restrictions.

Rules

Current NRA High power Rules apply. This is a NRA sanctioned league.
Rules 3.1, 3.1.1, 3.1.2, (M1, M1A, and AR-15) and rules 3.3, and 3.3.1 (NRA Match Rifle, a center fire rifle with metallic sights and a magazine capable of holding at least 5 rounds, or a semi-automatic match rifle meeting the above rules), are in effect at all matches. All normal match firing and scoring rules are also in effect. Rule 9.12, which prohibits alibis or refires, is not in effect for this league.

Eligibility

The league is open to DSC full members and associate members only. Full members are allowed to bring a guest to experience rifle competition. Guests are limited to 2 matches. If a guest wishes to participate in the league after 2 trial visits, they must become either a full member or an associate member.

Dates

Every Wednesday and Saturday, beginning 5/1/10 through 9/29/10 (except on any date when a DSC NRA approved High Power Match is scheduled, the match will take precedence).

Location

DSC 200 yd. Rifle Range 49800 Dequindre, Utica, MI

Starting Times

Wednesday Squadding closes 5:45 PM, commence fire 6 PM.
Friday Squadding closes 8:45 AM, commence fire 9 AM.
Saturday Squadding closes 8:45 AM, commence fire 9 AM.

Course of Fire

The NRA National Match Course, which consists of:
10 shots, Slow Fire, Standing in 10 minutes, SR target
10 shots, Rapid Fire, Sitting or Kneeling in 60 seconds, SR target
10 shots, Rapid Fire, Prone in 70 seconds, SR-42 target
20 shots, Slow Fire, Prone in 20 minutes, MR-52 target

Registration / Fees

A one-time (annual) league fee of \$40 is due prior to start of the season. An additional \$55 fee will be assessed for an associate membership. This fee includes NRA registration of scores, the league banquet and prizes at the season's end. Range fees are \$7 for full members, payable prior to the match. The associate member and guest fee is \$12. If a full member also wishes to participate in the Sporting rifle League, no additional league fees will be charged. All participants must submit a NRA registration card prior to start of the season. All submittals must be made to the league range officer prior to the participant's firing of the first league match.

League Scoring

A competitor's last 10 record matches shot are for DSC League score and standings for awards. Awards will be based on the Lewis System. A shooter must shoot 10 matches to qualify for awards. For NRA Classification, scores from the last 6 matches shot for score will be submitted to the NRA for classification. If a competitor doesn't fire 10 matches for score, the last 6 matches fired will be utilized for NRA classification. Scores are submitted to the NRA for classification at the end of the league.

Competitor Responsibilities

The competitor will conduct him or her self in a safe, professional manner at all times, and is responsible for all safety regulations. It is requested that cell phones be turned off or put on vibrate.

The NRA and DSC League rules do not permit the scoring of one's own target. All competitors are responsible for scoring the adjacent competitor's target, and for turning in that competitor's scored card to the range officer. All score cards must be signed by both the competitor and scorer. Competitors are responsible to make sure their score card is correct and turned in to the range officer. Failure to turn in a score card will result in a score of "0" for the competitor, per the RO's discretion.

If a competitor wishes to shoot a practice match, not for recorded score, he must notify the range officer prior to firing the first shot. He must clearly mark his scorecard with the word "practice", and will only be allowed to fire with the competitors if he doesn't displace anyone on the firing line who wishes to fire for record score.

Competitors are responsible for setting up and taking down their own targets, and helping with general set up and break down.

It's requested that competitors bring exact change to pay for daily range fees because change may not be available.

Challenges

The attending league range officer will be responsible for resolving any challenges, or rule/procedural disputes. The League Statistician will have the final decision over scoring/classification disputes.
